## BIBLE

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- Overview of God's redemptive history and plan, as revealed in the Hebrew Bible, especially as it points to the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ
- Overview of the history, theology, and culture of the Hebrews as revealed in history and Scripture, from creation through the Second Temple period
- Overview of the ways that biblical figures interacted with Egyptian, Babylonian, Assyrian, and Persian cultures
- Students will be adequately equipped to engage with contemporary culture

## MATH

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- Students will comprehend mathematical skills and concepts including: Integers, Expressions and equations, Rational numbers, Decimals, Fractions, Ratio and proportion, Percent and consumer applications, Date and statistics, Two-dimensional geometry, Measurement applications, Three-dimensional geometry, Probability, Patterns, relations, and functions, Polynomials

## LATIN

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- Differentiate between "reading" and "translating" in a foreign language
- Practice precision and attention to detail with new grammatical constructions
- Explore literature, art, and archaeology along with other fields related to Classics while learning about the Roman world
- Topics covered
  - pluperfect and future perfect tenses
  - time expressions
  - complex pronouns
  - degrees of adjectives and adverbs
  - 4th and 5th declensions

## ENGLISH

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- Language arts skills through an integrated program, including
  - grammar
  - vocabulary
  - reading comprehension strategies
  - shared Inquiry and Socratic discussion
  - oration and public speaking skills
  - research and essay writing
- Memory Work: scriptures, hymns, songs, dramatic performances, poetry relevant to the curriculum

## HISTORY

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- The Age of Exploration
- Atlantic History: Iberian and British Hegemony
- American Colonies: New Spain, New France, and New England
- Colonial America: Virginia, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, the Carolinas, Georgia
- The Enlightenment in France
- The First Great Awakening in America

- The American Revolution and the Declaration of Independence
- The Articles of Confederation, the Constitution, and the Ratification Debates

## INFORMAL LOGIC

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- Logic as the art and science of reasoning
- Focus on learning the fallacies that distract from making effective arguments
- Exploration of attacks on the source, appeals to emotion, red herrings, invalid presumptions or conclusions, and the need for clarity in effective argumentation

## LIFE SCIENCE

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- Biology, ecology, taxonomy, genetics, and anatomy, all at an introductory level
- Hands-on experiments and demonstrations connect theory to practice and further develop lab procedures and written lab reports
- Students are encouraged to continue to connect broad concepts in life science to observable details about life and all of its wonders.

## MUSIC:

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- Focus on the application of proper singing and choral techniques
- Learn correct vowel production, consonant production, breathing technique, expressiveness, and 2 to 3-part choral repertoire
- Grow in increased competence in note-reading, rhythm reading, score awareness, symbolic notational devices, and music directions written in other languages
- Perform with artistic integrity, giving careful attention to accuracy of pitches, rhythms, dynamics, and articulations
- Students will continue their journey in studying composers with reading, writing, and listening activities

## ART

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- Students find inspiration from Carl Linnaeus, the father of modern Taxonomy
- Students learn from artists like John James Audobon, who identified and documented 500 species of birds, for projects based around painting, printmaking, and ceramics.

## PE

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- Students learn how to best steward and honor their physical bodies through a Biblical worldview
- Perform complex combinations of movement specific to game, sport, rhythms, and/or physical activity settings
- Identify general principals of training
